SPECIAL ORDER Balsam Woolly Adelgid, Scott Zeidler, Utah Forest Service

Scott Zeidler presented information about the Balsam Woolly Adelgid (BWA) and its effects on our forests in Utah and specifically Big Cottonwood Canyon. The insect was first observed killing subalpine fir in northern Utah forest in 2017; it is now confirmed in eight counties. There has been a steady decline of subalpine fir in the Big Cottonwood area. As the sub-alpine fir trees have suffered from drought stress, leaving them vulnerable to the balsam woolly adelgid.

Scott reviewed the tree injury and symptoms, life history and identification, monitoring, management, and implications to forest health.

Scott asked that residents of Big Cottonwood Canyon be aware of subalpine trees on properties affected by BWA and take the proper action to remove and replace the trees. Basic Tree Risk Assessment Forms were made available to residents. Trees are an important part of our canyon and it is an owner's responsibility to provide for the safety of trees on his or her property.

Barbara thanked Scott for his informative presentation and the work he has done to keep our canyons safe and beautiful.

US Forest Service. Bekee Hotze noted a new Forest Service policy allows homeowners to cut and clean around trees within 150 ft of their home, even if it extends onto Forest Service property. A cutting permit is required and can be obtained at the Forest Service Office at 6944 S. 3000 East in Cottonwood Heights. If anyone has questions about permits to cut down trees or other information, please contact Becky Hotze.
