UPD REPORT Detective Cheryl Lenzer

The month of May, Big Cottonwood Canyon had a total of 158 calls for service. Most of the calls were traffic related- 1 Hit and Run, 5 Traffic Accidents, 1 DUI, 1 Canyon Vehicle Assist, numerous Traffic Stops. 2 Parking Notices, and several Traffic Citations were written. I apologize I don't have an exact total on citations written but they were for speeding. There were 5 Suspicious Circumstances, 5 Dogs in a Watershed, 2 Police Assists, 3 Juvenile calls, 1 Industrial Accident, 1 Burg Alarm, 1 Car Jacking, and 1 Search and Rescue.

This will be my last BCCA meeting as the UPD Canyon Patrol Detective. I won't say goodbye yet as my role just changes a little. I will be working as the Canyon Patrol Detective for the Salt Lake County Sheriff's Office. The new Brighton Detective will be Anna Walker, she will be giving the Town of Brighton updates starting in July. I think you all will enjoy working with her.

The Sheriff's Office has hired almost all the Canyon Patrol Officer positions. There are two open spots that could be filled by July 1, if they aren't those two open spots won't have a negative impact on the patrol functions. The swearing in ceremony will be July 1.

Now that summer is basically here, I want to remind everyone if you recreate in the canyons to leave your valuables at home or take them with you. I anticipate vehicle burglaries will be higher this year due to no construction equipment along the road to deter the bad guys. If you see anything suspicious or someone seems out of place at any of the trailheads, please call and report it.

Town of Brighton Update – Lise Brunhart

Title 19 of the Brighton Building Code has been approved, including keeping the existing 30' maximum building height as the average height from the median point to the highest point. The maximum home square footage was set at 5,000 sq. ft, with a possible exception for the Willow Loop HOA area to be decided at the July Town Council meeting.

The Town Council unanimously approved the Right of First Refusal Purchase Agreement for the Silver Fork Lodge. Lise took an informal poll of 122 residents that indicated 28% were in favor of the Agreement, 13% were undecided, 58% were opposed.

Rocky Mountain Power will bury powerlines from Cardiff to Silver Fork this summer. They will only work on trunk lines, not lines to individual homes. Salt Lake City Public Utilities will begin to bury a 36" steel conduit from the BCC Water Treatment Plant to the LCC Water Treatment Plant (Metro Water) in preparation for an updated BCC Water Treatment Plant, and to seismically reinforce the conduit. Due to these projects, there will be significant road construction/delays in BCC this summer.

UPD Update – Carolyn Keigley

Ed Twohill will be joining the canyon patrol as Sargeant. We will have 5-6 officers in BCC. This fall we will have a pancake breakfast and a greet and meet the officers working in our canyon.

Resort Updates
