THINKING OF RUNNING FOR AN OFFICE?

Qualifications to Run for Office

- Be a United States citizen at the time of filing
- Be a registered voter of the Town of Brighton
- Be a resident in Brighton for 12 consecutive months prior to the general election.
- Not be a convicted felon

2025 Election Calendar

- May 1 Notice of offices up for election (Brighton has Mayor + 2 Council seat terms that end in 2025)
- June 2 to June 9 Candidate Filing Period
- August 1 Last day to register to vote
- August 12 Primary Election
- November 4 General Election

Prospective candidates can declare their candidacy at the Greater Salt Lake Municipal Services District Offices, 860 W. LeVoy Drive, Taylorsville, UT 84123. They will provide forms and information about financial disclosure, how to submit a candidate profile to the VOTE.UTAH.GOV agency, and a pledge of fair campaign practices.

CANYON PARKING AND TRAFFIC ISSUES

At a recent Town Council Meeting, Solitude's General Manager Amber Broadaway, pointed out that Solitude spends a significant amount of money to reduce canyon traffic. Brighton Resort has similar costs. Both resorts say they have no interest in bringing more cars into the canyon and are committed to finding ways to move cars off the highway. Here's a cost estimate from Solitude:

- \$500,000 annually to provide free public bus service for all IKON pass holders.
- \$25,000/year for the upkeep of the Park n' Ride at the mouth of BCC.
- \$225,000/year for employees and guests to have a free UTA bus ticket.
- \$35,000/year for free gear check service at Moonbeam for guests.
- \$75,000/year for the private employee LeBus service
- \$40,000/year to supply 12 UTA Rideshare vans for employees
- \$50,000/year to pay employees when they take the Rideshare vans (\$30/each day)
- \$25,000/year for rental space at Hillside Shopping Plaza to park employee vehicles.
- \$15,000 for the Big Cottonwood Mobility Action Plan (BCC-MAP) study in 2024.

Other support initiatives include:

- Introduction of paid parking in 2018.
- The paid parking program incentivizes carpooling, which recently had a 57% increase in the number of vehicles with four+ on the busiest days.
- Solitude funded the creation of the Solitude carpool app, and extended free use to Brighton resort, a platform that averages about 250 ride shares per month.
- Solitude brought the Town of Brighton and Brighton resort to the table to implement a canyon-wide parking reservation system.
- Solitude altered lift hours to 8 am opening in winter and 5pm closing in the spring to help alleviate canyon congestion.
- When the Town of Brighton and USFS raised concerns about lack of summer bathrooms, Solitude opened its main facility to the public for 24-hour access.
- Solitude has partnered with Wasatch Backcountry Alliance to run shuttles to the resort for their uses for the last two seasons.


Mayor Knopp is urging UDOT to implement the projects in the BCC-MAP study that would allow 2 lanes around the Brighton Loop and mobility hubs at Brighton and Solitude to make bus service more efficient. UDOT's final decision will come out in May 2025.

Jason reminded everyone of the total lunar eclipse on March 13. The lecture was to end with

a ride on the lift to view the winter constellations, but a snow squall scuttled the grand finale. Suddenly a multi-jointed bright green monster groomer, lights ablaze, appeared right in front of the Milly windows to tamp down the snow. Wide-eyed viewers were transfixed by the light show, almost as amazing as a ride on the lift. The event was sponsored by the Brighton Resort and the Brighton Institute.

CCF PARTNERSHIP

The Town of Brighton will fund several Cottonwood Canyons Foundation (CCF) programs this coming year:

- \$15,000 for Weed Mitigation
- \$5,000 for Adopt-A-Trail Program (Butler Fork and Mill D North Trails)
- \$15,000 for the Naturalist Program at Silver Lake



Silver Lake receives almost 100,000 visitors a year. The

Naturalist Program provides visitor information services, Junior Ranger Program for kids, Family Nature Tours, restroom, trail, and parking lot maintenance.

Mayor Knopp noted that CCF is also forming a fuels mitigation because of Forest Service budget cuts. The program costs are estimated at \$23,000. Other partners that donate to the CCF include the Lyon Family Foundation, the National Forest Foundation and Brighton, Solitude, Alta, and Snowbird Resorts.

SUMMER WEED WARRIOR SIGN-UP

The Cottonwood Canyons Foundation is coordinating a Summer Weed Pull for Brighton Communities. Ella Abelli-Amen, the CCF Weed Mitigation Director, is volunteering to bring in her crew to help citizen volunteers with noxious weed concerns. Forest Glen, Brighton, and Cardiff have already signed up for her help. 
