REPORTS

UPD. Officer William Wayne reported waters in the canyons will run high as the weather warms. Please stay clear of rivers and other waterways. We could experience potential flooding.

UFA. Recruitment Camp will commence in June with 28 new firefighters. Wildland hands on drills will be conducted and the entire department will participate. As we transition from winter to spring a few hikers have been unprepared and assistance was needed to get them off the trails. Please be prepared as you venture into the backcountry.

BUSINESS

Brighton Area Land Use - Marc Fletcher presented Concept Plans for the area lying near 8041 Old Prospect Ave. One Cabin is currently located on the property and an additional cabin will be constructed. Mayor's Office - Rich Graham reported that Mayor Wilson will hold several open houses. UFA & UPD will continue to be funded for the canyon through House Bill 187, until Dec. 31, 2021. The town of Brighton will need to work with the Legislature for continued funding. Catherine Kanter, will serve as deputy mayor of regional operations, and Mike Reberg, will serve as her assistant. Rick Graham will be leaving. Don thanked Rick for his service and dedication. We wished him well in his new adventures and showed appreciation for all he has contributed to Big Cottonwood Canyon. A motion was made to submit the names of Bart Reuling, Keith Zusapan and Brooke Derr to fill vacancies on the Mountainous Planning Commission. The motion was 2nd and passed with no opposed. We would like to see four people from Big Cottonwood Canyon on the Commission.

Trials Report - Cardiff Fork and Willow Heights trails will be worked on in the fall. Discussion ensued about putting together a group that would adopt and maintain one of the trails in the canyon. A motion was made to table the adoption until we had more information about the program. The motion was seconded and approved with no one opposed.

Emergency Operations - Doug Fry reported that the 1st draft of the Emergency Plan is complete and presented for approval. Booklets were handed out and Barbara asked that each of us read and make comments on the plan. Don thanked all on the team for the hard work.
