UPD. Bill Wayne reported that the Guard Road will open next week. He also passed around a copy of the Survey Count of Vehicles for the Memorial Day weekend (5-23-19 to 5-27-19), which showed a total of 18,579 vehicles.

UFA. Dusty reported that the 25 new recruits are finally in-station for journeyman training. UFA has conducted Swiftwater Training and Fire School 101. BCCA's Keith Zuspan attended the Fire School 101 Training.

BUSINESS

Adopt-A-Highway. Tom Loken and Jeff Bossard reported that the event was postponed by one week because of snow. The breakfast was wonderful (with thanks to Dan Knopp who provided the free breakfast), and the volunteers went right to work. Many thanks to Tom and Jeff for coordinating this event!

Town Transition Team. The team submitted a proposed budget to the MSD. They also met with UFA and UPD and Utah Governments Trust to determine what insurance to buy in January. They also reviewed town Emergency Plans. (see <http://www.bigcottonwood.org/town-of-brighton.html> for more info.)

HAWK Signal. Discussion was presented on the High-intensity Activated Crosswalk (HAWK) proposal for installation of a center median red light signal at the Cardiff-Mill D area in the fall of 2019. The HAWK is only operational when activated by a pedestrian. When a pedestrian pushes the button, the signal turns yellow, then red. Motorists must stop at solid red light. When signal begins to flash, motorists may proceed with caution if clear. The signal remains black if not activated. BCCA members commented on the safety improvement this project will provide as traffic increases in the canyon, and were unanimously in favor of the project.

Canyon Planning Projects. Laynee Jones reported that the Legislature budgeted \$65 for Little Cottonwood Canyon, which will likely include avalanche sheds, Lisa Falls parking and maybe a parking terrace at the mouth of the canyon. The CCTAP (Cottonwood Canyons Transportation Action Plan) will include Big Cottonwood, and will propose an improved bus system with 5 minute headways and parking structure at the mouth of the canyon. Both studies will consider tolling and coordination of planning and projects for both canyons. Go to the Central Wasatch Commission website to register your opinions about the studies.

Brighton Institute. Don Despain reported that History Tours of Brighton Cabins have been scheduled. Sketch nights will begin in June. The Institute will sponsor a booth at the Sunday Flea Market to promote canyon artists. The summer mailing will go out soon; please check the website for up to date information.

Solitude Mountain Resort. Kim Mayhew reported the resort is in maintenance mode, looking forward to summer.
