UPD REPORT Detective Cheryl Lenzer • For the month of March there were 243 calls for UPD. That is significantly less calls than in March 2023, we had 378. 2023 was a huge snow year so I went back to March of 2022 and found we had 348 calls for service. Again, our call volume was down for this year. Kind of a nice feeling that some of our efforts at policing in the canyon may be the result. At least that's what I'm going to think. Still with the 243 calls this year, we had 1 Canyon Closure, 9 Canyon Vehicle Assists, 4 Citizen Assists, 1 Civil, 1 Canyon Rescue (non-SAR), 1 Hit and Run, 9 Traffic Accidents, 1 Impound, 5 Traffic Enforcement, 4 Camping in the Watershed, 1 Dog in the Watershed, 2 Graffiti Damage, 1 Private Property Damage, 2 Disorderly Conduct, 1 Weapon Violation, 2 Suspicious Circumstances, 1 Police Assist, 3 Skier Collisions, and 9 Ski Thefts at Brighton and 1 at Solitude. Officers wrote 15 Traffic Citations and 18 Parking Notices written in the Town of Brighton.

The Drop 13 Half Marathon is scheduled for June 8.

UDOT TIPS & SUGGESTIONS

- 1. Pick up large trash bags (if you want them) by Tom Loken's front door. Tom's address: 6532 S. Moose Creek Lane in Silver Fork
- 2. Leave large trash bags on the highway shoulder for pick-up by $\overline{\text{June 1}^{\text{st}}}$. Close bags securely.
- 3. If you can't lift something (ex: a tire), leave it on the road with a large trash bag wedged under it as a marker.
- 4. If you use plastic grocery bags for pick-up, please dispose of them in an area dumpster, that would save UDOT many trips up the canyon. (Thanks!)
- 5. Remember to wear gloves! (Water bottles and hats help too.)
