MINUTES. The Minutes for March 15, 2021 were approved as submitted.

REPORTS

UPD Report. Lee Arnold reported that there are three new canyon officers. Welcome to all. The road was closed on Saturday for three hours due to a death in a motorcycle crash. On the same day a motorist fled from an officer and was caught at the bottom of the canyon and arrested. Lee reminded everyone, if you have guns please lock them up and record the serial numbers. You must have the serial number to report stolen guns. There were 365 canyon UPD calls for March. Many watershed (dogs) and traffic citations were issued.

SLCounty Liaison. Jocelyn Romero reported rezoning ordinances for Salt Lake County will be sent to Barbara and will be presented to the planning commission in May. Volunteer agreements and disclosures are also needed if BCCA wants to apply for funding from the MSD.

BUSINESS

CWC Call for Projects. BCCA submitted a project requesting funds for replacement of 3 geology signs in the canyon (Remnants of an Ancient Sea-Mile Post 2.3/ Storm Mountain Quartzites-MP2.8 / and Mississippian Marble-MP7.2) BCCA will work with the Utah Geological Association (UGA) to fund and execute the project. BCCA and the CWC will each contribute \$3000. The UGA contribution will be in-kind hours for creation of the signage and labor for installation.

BCCA also agreed to continue to help fund the Graffiti Busters if they are granted a CWC short-term project. John Knoblock submitted a project request for a bridge across the stream at the bottom of Butler Fork. Those were submitted to Central Wasatch Commission.

Adopt-A-Highway Project. Tom Loken has the UDOT trash bags at his house. Please stop by to pick up a bag and take care of your assigned section. Bags on the road will be collected by UDOT on June 1.

4th of July Parade. Do we want to push it back to the 3rd of July on Saturday? Carolyn suggested we watch COVID numbers for a month and then make a decision when we have a better assessment of the safety. The staging area for the Parade could be moved into the Chapel area. Lee suggested that if we start at the church parking lot, people will need to go around one and half times to empty out the loop. Doug Fry addressed the following concerns: the staging area is congested and unsafe. Children on scooters and bikes unsupervised is a major concern. The pace of the parade and order of the parade needs to be planned. Candy is tossed and children run out to the road in danger of being hit. The character of the parade was discussed. Many options were discussed. Barbara asked for volunteers to do some research on other small-town parades and bring back suggestions. If we have people register it

may help the safety factors related to the parade. Barbara suggested a group come together and create a plan to be presented at the next meeting.

Resort Updates

Kim Mayhew – BCCA and Brighton Institute presented a plaque to Kim in honor of her service to the canyon . We want to thank Kim for all her work and dedication to BCCA and the canyon community. Solitude will close on Sunday April 18th. Kim reported that Solitude had a successful season, opening, staying open and keeping everyone safe.

Randy Dole – Brighton had a challenging and successful year. They will be closing on the 18th. Silver Lake board walk project may pose some parking issues. The Forest Service will completely replace the boardwalk. Brighton is running kids camps this year. Looking forward to seeing everyone this summer.

Other Community Input

Brooke Derr brought up the concern with the drought and the fire issue this summer. The suggestion was made that we make the topic an agenda item.
