ROCKY MOUNTAIN POWER UPDATE

Planning is underway to bury 7 miles of RMP mainline in the canyon this summer to limit wildfire liability Several homeowners inquired about burying lines in residential areas also. RMP replied that the cost would be about \$20,000/home and take a few years to finish. On that report, homeowners were simply not able to proceed with any further inquiry because of the cost. Would the Town of Brighton be able to fund this project over several years? It would be a huge deliverable for its citizens and for the forest.

Projected Cost to Bury Electric Line in Brighton: \$20,000 x 567 = \$11,340,000

RESIDENT PASS ROLLOUT

UPD has supplied 800 Resident Passes for the Emergency Teams to distribute. To date 490 passes have been mailed to 148 households (average of 3/household). 386 were distributed by Emergency Teams. UPD will supply 90 more passes. To date the project has cost \$91 in postage. Brighton has added 63 new contacts from property owners who were not on the mailing list previously.
